Family Assistance Program

The purpose of the Family Assistance Program is to provide collaborative services to the benefit and safety of Tribal Families and community members. These services will be provided in such a way as to protect children and elders, maintain the dignity and independence of our clients and to preserve the culture, values, and traditions of the Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe.

Tribal TANF

(Temporary Assistance for Needy Families)

Made possible with a grant from US Department of Health & Human Services, Administration for Children and Families.

Provides cash assistance for very low-income families and self-sufficiency assistance to help low-income families continue to work.

Eligibility Requirements

To be eligible to receive cash assistance:

- A family must include a dependent child 18 or younger or a pregnant woman in her last trimester of pregnancy.
- The family must reside on the Port Gamble S'Klallam Reservation and include a member of a federally recognized Indian Tribe or the family must reside in Kitsap County and include a member of the Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe.
- A dependent child 16, 17 or 18 years old must be in school full time for that child to be eligible for the family cash assistance.
- A family must cooperate with the Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe Child support Program.
- The family must not have exceeded its 60-month life time limit, unless exemptions apply.

Food Bank

The food bank is stocked by donations and funding from the Washington State Department of Agriculture, Emergency Food Assistance Program as well as other Tribal funding.

Anyone can come use the food bank. All you need to do is fill out a form. Please call any one of us to have contact-less porch pickup

Emergency Food Vouchers

Emergency food vouchers are available to Tribal Members. ****These are available to households quarterly, based on availability.***

**There is a SECURE DROP BOX (black) for any program paperwork to be submitted at the backdoor entrance of the CFS building. Paperwork can be dropped off during or after business hours.

**There is also a pickup box (red) for any blank program applications that can be picked up to fill out and return.

(Low Income Energy Assistance Program/Low Income Household Water Assistance Program)

Currently Available

- Households must meet income guidelines of 60% of State Median Income.
- Other Eligibility requirements, such as a Tribal member head of household on the bill, residing within Kitsap County.

Tribal Utilities Assistance

Available to Tribal households with a PSE bill in a Tribal member's name, \$100 benefit per household.
