WOOD PERMIT INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Black out the dates <u>you will be using</u> the permit or leave them blank until you're sure. Example, if today is October 1, you would block out the month October, and the number 1. Permits do not have to be used the same day they were issued. Example, if you think you might be cutting wood over the weekend, get your permits Friday, but don't black out the date until you are sure you will harvest that day.
- 2. Display the permit in your rear truck window until the wood has reached its destination. If you are using a designated harvester, list their name on the permit and make sure its promptly displayed on the vehicle that is hauling the fire wood. If you are transporting firewood for personal use off of the reservation, you may obtain a separate wood hauling permit for transport. Wood Hauling permits are good for 72 hours only.

NOTES

You may get up to 5 permits issued at a time.

Once the wood has been harvested and delivered, the permit can be disposed of. If you didn't use your permit, call NR at 360-297-6294 and let them know. **Permits are only good for the day that is blocked out on the permit itself.**

Tribal households have a 5 cord per year limit. If the full 5 cords are harvested, 20 permits would be issued, depending on the size of the truck. If you have questions about how many truckloads are in a cord, there is a guideline hanging on the wall next to the designated cutting area map.

Copies of maps and the woodcutting code are available, please take one with you!
