Legal Department Changes

Effective, January 1, 2025, our long-time tribal member lead attorney, Gina Steiner will be retiring from the legal department as she has accepted a position as an administrative director, overseeing the Tribe's Court and Police department. Gina will work alongside Destiny Oliver, and Tamara Gage, under Executive Director, Kelly Sullivan.

Gina moved to in-house general counsel from the Tribe's Children and Family Services attorney in 2007 after serving three years there, when her mentor and predecessor, Tallis King George left to work for the Puyallup Tribe. Then, Ron Charles was the Chair and Harry Fulton the Vice. Jeromy, Kelly and Betty also served on Council. Since Gina's time here, she's served with many council members like Lena Tunkura, Kari DeCoteau, Francine Swift, Marie Hebert, Jamie Aikman, Chad Sullivan, and many others. She was here when Dallas, Tallis, Laurie, Greg and Marilyn all worked here. The only remaining administrative employee from that era, besides Gina, is Alice Bundalian. (We have other longterm employees like Sue Hanna and Kay Jones and others).

When Gina first began her career here with the Tribe as a front desk receptionist around 1990, the Tribe only employed 80 or so employees. Since then, the Tribe has expanded its land base from 1,340 acres to 3,053 acres (1,707 reservation lands) and now has approximately 350 employees. In Gina's time, the Tribe moved from a small bingo hall to offering full gaming and built the Point Hotel. The Tribe destroyed the old Point no Point Treaty Council building, removed "the Dock" to build a large boat ramp, and legalized marijuana. The Tribe has grown and changed a lot since Gina first started here a front desk receptionist, and then 20 years as an attorney for the Tribe. We're confident she will continue to help the Tribe grow and succeed in her new role and we're happy she's remaining with the Tribe. Good luck, Gina!

We ask community and staff members to direct all legal questions to Steven Moe, interim Director of the legal department. Steve, along with David Robinson and Tashe Streun can help address the Tribe's legal needs. Gina will be focusing on her new role, and not available to address legal questions.
