

BASIC NEEDS SUPPORT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM 2024

The Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribal Council supports granting assistance to eligible enrolled PGST members 18 years and older to promote the general welfare of the Tribe by providing one-time financial assistance to tribal members to apply towards annual transportation costs.

The Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe recognizes the need to ensure it's members are able to get to their destinations for required daily living needs.

All ENROLLED PGST Members ages 18 years and older will receive assistance of \$4,000.00, upon completion of the application. Applicant must be 18 years old by the last day the assistance application period is open. Necessary requirements below:

CRITERIA:

Must be an ENROLLED Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribal Member, 18 years and older, complete and submit an application within the specified time frame. Applicant must be 18 years old by the last day the assistance application period is open.

APPLICATIONS:

Applications can be found online at pgst.nsn.us, or at the front desk of the main Tribal Center starting Tuesday November 12, 2024 through Friday December 13, 2024. The deadline for applications is Friday December 13, 2024 at 4:30 p.m. PST. No exceptions will be made. An application must be completed, signed and submitted by the deadline. If it is not complete, it will not be processed.

APPLICATION SUBMISSION:

Applications can be completed online at pgst.nsn.us the members only page or dropped off at the Black drop box in FRONT OF THE TRIBAL CENTER (left side). PLEASE DO NOT HAND TO STAFF.

NOTE: Do NOT email Applications. Either fill out the application online or submit a hard copy.
