Natural Resources

Just a reminder that wood cutting permits are required to harvest firewood on the reservation. The only exception to this are log piles that the Tribe has made available. Designated harvesters are allowed according to our permit restrictions. Permits are available to be checked out at Natural Resources and you may receive up to 5 permits at a time for a total of up to 20 permits per year. If you live off reservation, a separate wood hauling permit is required. At no time is it legal to sell firewood from the forested areas of the reservation.

Also, permits are for personal use only and must be used only in our designated wood cutting areas located across from S'Klallam Hill/upper housing. Windfallen trees can be harvested in designated areas in the access road behind the ball field and skate park as long as they can be harvested near the road or wood carried out on foot. Please do not drive vehicles or sport utility vehicles off the main forest road as this damages healthy trees. Paper copies of the designated cutting areas are available at natural resources. You can call Nikki at 360-865-2678 if you have questions.

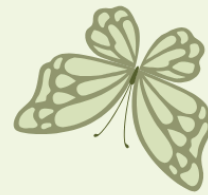

If you are a family member of a previous carver or have materials stored in the original carving shed, we kindly ask you to reach out to our Culture Program Manager, Alicia Fulton. 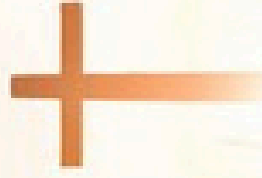

VIBRIO SEASON

Anyone who plans to commercially harvest oysters from **May 1st through September 30th** must have a current Vibrio sticker.

Those who took and passed the test last year, or took the training last year may take the test this year.

If you did not take the test or class last year, you must attend a training class prior to harvesting oysters after May 1st.

Tests will be available in the Natural Resources office starting April 7th. **You must bring your fishing ID with you to receive your sticker.**

Interested tribal members (21 or older) can be licensed **by a drawing of those paying a \$1,000.00 license fee plus a \$1,000.00 flat fee, cash-in-advance.** The flat fee will cover the expense for Sanikan, dumpster, recycle bin, fuel for generator, and an electrician. You must be 21 years or older at the time of the drawing. License will be valid only for the authorized tribal member(s) and shall not be transferable, please note your license must be posted at all times.

SEASON DURATION: Fireworks can be sold beginning on Friday, June 6, 2025 (4 weekends before the 4th). The last day of selling will be July 11, 2025 (1 week after the 4th).

INSURANCE: The license will be required to obtain liability insurance. Proof of insurance, naming the Tribe as “insured” as well as the license, will be required before any fireworks sales can occur. **A copy of insurance must be submitted to the accounting department before opening day.**

SELLING STANDS SIZES: Stands will be 12 feet wide by 24 feet long. The long side will be the sales counter. **There will be no extensions/add ons to your stand.** The Tribe will stake the site for each licensee.

CLEANLINESS: The sales stands will be required to keep their locations clean and free from litter. The stands and all the signs, both on and off reservation **must** be removed by July 20, 2025 at day end.

Official Firework signs will be purchased and put up and placed off reservation.

SLEEPOVERS: Although licensee will be allowed to stay overnight with their stands, no partying will be allowed. ***THERE WILL BE NO ALCOHOL OR MARIJUANA ALLOWED IN THE STANDS AT ANY TIME.***

SANIKAN/DUMPSTER/RECYCLE BINS: An additional sanikan and dumpster will be rented for the sales season for the area.

ELECTRICITY: Due to construction happening at NKDC there is no available power to set up the stands and street lights. The Tribe will help by providing a generator. Utilities will be in charge of its operation. An electrician will be set up to connect the street lights to the generators. The cost of fuel and the cost for an electrician will be included in the fees paid.

PHONE LINES/INTERNET: Phone Lines/Internet **will not** be available in the 2025 location.

NO FIREWORKS ARE TO BE EXPLODED AT ANY TIME, WITHIN 300 FEET OF THE FIREWORKS STANDS AND/OR ANY NKDC BUILDINGS OR STRUCTURES!!!! FIRST INFRACTIONS WILL RESULT IN THE OFFENDING LICENSEE'S BOOTH BEING CLOSED 24 HOURS. SECOND INFRACTION WILL RESULT IN PERMANENT CLOSURE.

Tribal members interested in entering the drawing to sell fireworks can do so by filling out the information below and returning this application with all fees and deposits. **(By money order or cashier's checks - no personal checks will be accepted) to the Tribal Center Accounting Offices by 3:45 PM on Friday April 18, 2025 in a sealed envelope marked with your name and to the attention: Tawny DeCoteau - Executive Assistant.**

One application per Tribal member. You must be 21 years old to submit an application. Unsuccessful applicants will be given a full refund of all the monies submitted.

An in person and Facebook live recorded drawing will be held at 4:00 PM April 18, 2025 at the front desk in the tribal center.
