

Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe Retail Sales Tax: An FAQ

*Tax will apply to most entities that sell retail items;
PGST members are exempt with Tribal ID*

What is the Tribal Retail Sales Tax (Code Chapter 23.05)?

The Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe is implementing a retail sales tax. The rate will mirror Kitsap County's retail sales tax rate of 9.2% and may be adjusted if the State or County makes changes to their sales tax.

When does the Tribal Retail Sales Tax go into effect?

January 1, 2026. Tribal Council enacted the new section of Title 23 in October 2025.

Where will the tax be charged?

The Tribe and all tribal entities will be required to collect a retail

sales tax. This tax applies to all "retail sales" on reservation sold by the Tribe. Retail sales occur when people purchase goods and services, like food, beverages, hotel rooms, and more. The tax will mainly be seen at PGST-owned entities that sell retail items, like the Point Casino (and all its restaurants and bars), Gliding Eagle Market, and Eagle's Nest Espresso.

Non-prepared foods (think groceries like eggs, milk, etc) are exempt, as well as gas and marijuana sales.

Do Tribal members have to pay the Tribal Retail Sales Tax?

No. Tribal members are exempt from the Tribal Retail Sales Tax. Tribal members do not have to pay tax, as long as they present a valid Tribal ID at the time of purchase.

Do vendors at events have to collect the Tribal Retail Sales Tax?

No. Vendors at events on the reservation or at PGST-owned businesses are exempt from collecting the Tribal Retail Sales Tax. This applies to Tribal and non-tribal vendors.

Are small businesses, not owned by PGST, operating on the reservation required to collect the Tribal Retail Sales Tax?

No. The Tribal Retail Sales Tax only applies to businesses owned and operated by PGST.

How will the money collected be used?

PGST is dedicated to ensuring the health, welfare, and economic success of its vibrant community through education and economic development, as well as the preservation and protection of the rich culture, traditions, language, homelands, and natural resources of the S'Klallam people. 100% of the revenue collected from the Tribal Retail Sales Tax will go to support this mission.

Effective
January 1, 2026

Applies to most PGST entities that sell retail items. Does not apply to individual PGST members.

The Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribe is implementing a Retail Sales Tax.


At the start of the New Year, the Tribe will collect a new retail sales tax, which will mirror Washington State's current rate. The tax will apply to common retail purchases, the same way food, beverages, hotel rooms, goods, and other services are taxed by the state off-res.

The tax is for the benefit of the Tribe. Tribal members will not be required to pay or collect taxes for sale on-res. All tax proceeds will be used to help fund the Tribe.

Tribal members are exempt from retail sales tax.

Tribal ID is required at time of purchase. Tax will be charged without valid Tribal ID. Tax cannot be refunded.

Q & A with PGST Council

Chairwoman Amber Caldera

How long have you been on Tribal Council?

I have served on Tribal Council since July 2020.

Why did you run to be on Tribal Council?

I ran because I care deeply about our Tribe and our future. I wanted to give back in a meaningful way and help ensure that our decisions reflect our values, protect our sovereignty, and create opportunities for our people—especially our youth and Elders. Leadership is not always easy, but it is important work, and I felt called to step up. I also wanted to put my education to work, as I have a Master's Degree in Indigenous law from the University of Oklahoma.

What's the most surprising thing you've discovered about being on Council?

How much responsibility comes with every decision. Even the smallest choices can have long-term impacts on families, programs, and future generations. It has reinforced for me how important it is to listen carefully, ask questions, and always keep our people at the center of the work.

What are you most passionate about? How do you apply this in your work with Council?

I am most passionate about caring for our people—especially through education and building a strong, sustainable future for the Tribe. I apply this by advocating for thoughtful investments, supporting staff who do the day-to-day work, and pushing for decisions that balance immediate needs with long-term vision.

What are your goals in supporting the PGST community as a Council member?

My goals are to strengthen communication, support programs that directly benefit our members, protect our lands and resources, and help build systems that will serve our Tribe well for generations to come. I want our members to feel informed, supported, and proud of where we are headed.



What is one thing you want the PGST community to know about you?

I am still learning, and I take this responsibility seriously. I lead with care, honesty, and a deep love for our Tribe. I may not have all the answers, but I am committed to listening, showing up, and doing the work.

How can community members reach out to you?

Community members are welcome to reach out by email, through the Tribal Administration office, or by attending Council meetings. I do my best to stay accessible while balancing the responsibilities of the role.



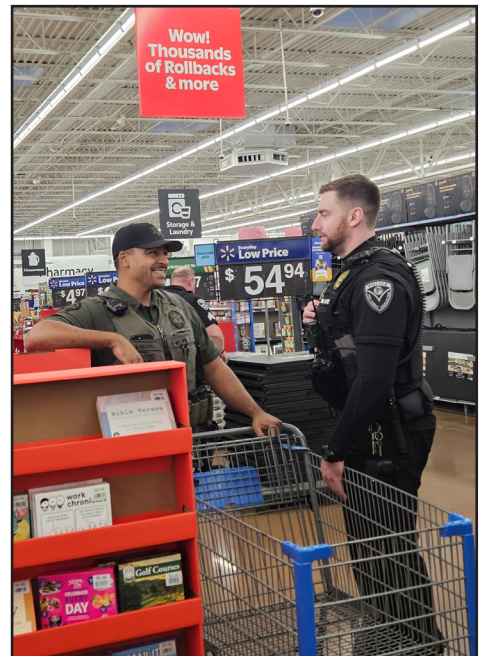
PGST Police Participate in Shop With A Cop

In December, PGST Police partnered with local law enforcement throughout Kitsap County and members of the military for Shop with a Cop. The event's sponsor is Walmart in Poulsbo.

2026 Seasonal Family Gathering Assistance Open

The Port Gamble S'Klallam Tribal Council supports assistance to eligible enrolled PGST members aged 18 years and older to help with family gatherings, socialization, and honoring of seasonal changes.

Applications can be submitted electronically via the website (Members Only section) or be obtained from the Front Desk. Paper applications should be returned to the Black Drop Box in front of the Tribal Center. Do not hand applications to staff.

Applications are due February 9, 2026 by 4:30 pm. No exceptions.

Food Bank Open to All PGST Families in Need

The PGST Food Bank is open from 8 to 11:45 am and 1:15 to 4 pm, Monday through Friday. To access, please come into the Children and Family Services building and speak with Miranda at the front desk.

As a gentle reminder, each family may use the Food Bank once a week and CFS asks that you wait in the lobby of the CFS building or in your car while a CFS staff member assists.

Please let the staff know if there are any allergies and they will do their best to provide alternatives, if they are able.

Please be sure to be accurate with a count of household members as this determines how much food can be provided.

If you bring a list of the most needed items, they will do their best to fill this need.

The Food Bank also stocks diapers and hygiene items as well as food items.

Reminder: Call 9-1-1 to Contact PGST Police

PGST's Public Safety Department would like to remind community members to utilize the Kitsap 911 system for any law enforcement needs.

As there is no full-time admin staff and the department tries to limit the time officers in the office, calling 9-1-1 is the quickest and most efficient way to contact PGST officers.

The Kitsap 911 system handles both non-emergency and emergency calls. The dispatcher can determine the urgency of the call.
