



Anthony Jones Named CEO of Noo-Kayet Investments

Anthony is the first PGST member to lead the Tribe's economic development division

Noo-Kayet Investments (“NKI”)—a corporation formed by the Port Gamble S’Klallam Tribe (“PGST”) to manage economic development and its varied business entities—has named Anthony Jones as their new CEO.

Anthony is an attorney with a strong background in Native American law and economic development. His experience includes close to a decade as in-house counsel for the Tulalip Tribes. Most recently, he supported the award-winning Native American law practice at Dorsey & Whitney LLP, a full-service international law firm.

In 2024, Anthony was named to the prestigious “Native American 40 Under 40” list from the National Center for American Indian Enterprise Development. He earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) before attending Washington University for his Juris Doctor degree.

In addition to Anthony’s impressive credentials and experience, he is the first PGST member to take on the top leadership role at NKI since it was formed in 2008.

“To see one of our own Tribal members step into the CEO role at Noo-Kayet is powerful,” said PGST Chairwoman Amber Caldera. “Anthony’s experience as an attorney strengthens our enterprises, and, just as importantly, he understands our history, our values, and our responsibility to our people. When leadership comes from within, you know the Tribe’s best interests will always come first.”

As CEO, Anthony will oversee the existing business assets and operations owned by PGST. This includes The Point Casino & Hotel, Gliding Eagle Market, and High Point, as well as interests off the reservation, such as Minder Meats, a butcher shop and meat processing facility that was operated in Kitsap County by the same family for over 80 years until the Tribe purchased the legacy business in 2025.

“As a proud Port Gamble S’Klallam Tribal member, I am honored to be able to serve my community as CEO of Noo-Kayet Investments,” said Anthony. “I am grateful to past leaders for building a strong economic foundation and positioning us for continued success. I look forward to building on that legacy by bringing the experience I’ve gained in the broader business world back home. I am eager to pursue new opportunities and help create continued sustainable growth for our Tribe.”

PGST Community Health Center Opens On-Site Pharmacy



On February 19, the PGST Community Health Center held a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the soft opening of its own pharmacy.

On hand to acknowledge this important achievement in the evolution of PGST's dedication to providing its members with the best healthcare opportunities were Chairwoman Amber Caldera, Health Director Jolene Sullivan, and Dr. Luke McDaniel, Medical Director. Members of the community were invited to attend the event and then take a tour of the new facility.



With the soft opening event, the pharmacy became available to fill prescriptions for only uninsured PGST PRC members. While the pharmacy is fully licensed and staffed, the Health Center is working on approvals to be able to bill insurance payors. They are prioritizing the most used insurance plans in order to serve the largest number of patients as quickly as possible. PGST providers will be notified once all insurance payors are online so prescriptions can be sent directly to the pharmacy.



PGST Community Health Center providers are beginning to transfer prescriptions to the pharmacy on an as-needed basis or upon patient request. Additional announcements will be made to let patients know when they can begin asking outside providers or current pharmacies to transfer prescriptions.

When the pharmacy is ready to begin accepting prescriptions originating from providers outside the PGST Community Health Center or transfers from other pharmacies, patients will be able to request prescription transfers from their current pharmacy or outside provider.

The PGST Community Health Center Pharmacy is open Monday thru Friday 9 am to 6 pm. They are closed for lunch from 2-3 pm. They can be reached for refills, prescription questions, and general information at 833-573-4348.

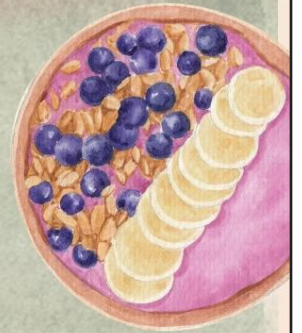

Anthony will also be responsible for executing projects outlined in the Tribe's Master Plan, while sourcing investment and acquisition opportunities that align with the Tribe's values and economic priorities.

For Anthony, who moved his family to the PGST reservation soon after starting at Tulalip Tribes (necessitating a several-hour-a-day commute), staying close to his community and true to his culture has always been a priority. "My goal is to pursue economic development in a way that's consistent with and furthers the teachings of our cultural values. Ultimately, I see myself as a public servant, whose job it is to give voice to the community and build upon past efforts," said Anthony.

He also stressed the importance of creating pathways that allow Tribal members to thrive professionally throughout their lifetimes: "Providing opportunities for Tribal members is a big part of what Noo-Kayet does. A lot of Tribal members get their first jobs through NKI (at one the Tribe's business entities). I want to see that grow so all Tribal members have increased job opportunities or have the support they need for entrepreneurship."

Anthony officially began as CEO on March 9, 2026. He takes over the reins from Eric Croft, who served as Interim CEO during the search for new leadership. Croft will maintain his position as NKI's COO working alongside Jones.

In February, Councilperson I Renee Veregge, Housing Director Kara Horton, and Mandi Moon, Member Benefits Coordinator, attended National American Indian Housing Council in Washington DC. While in town, they visited with the offices of Rep. Randall, Sen Murray, and Sen Cantwell to advocate for housing funding and the reauthorization of the Native American Housing Assistance and Self-Determination Act (NAHASDA).

NAHASDA was last reauthorized in 2008 and expired in 2013. Among other benefits, NAHASDA recognizes Tribal sovereignty to govern maximum rent requirements and makes tribes eligible for HUD Housing Counseling grants.

Tribal communities, like PGST, face significant housing shortages that current appropriations can't keep up with. While recent increases have helped, investment in Tribal housing can't keep pace with inflation and housing needs.

Elder Assistance for 2026 Now Available

The PGST Council supports granting assistance to eligible PGST enrolled Tribal elders aged 55 years and older to help with expenses associated with their principal residence. Elders may apply for \$3,000 per calendar year. Elders may choose to receive two \$1,500 payments or one \$3,000 lump sum.

Applications are available via the Members only section of the PGST website or from the Front Desk. They are being accepted now and through October 19, 2026 at 4:30 pm.
